00-64	Grosso, Milvey, Thompson	History of parents. Mother born at the Camp Bird Mine above Ouray, Colorado. Father worked at the mill at Idorado mine in Telluride. Describes the first houses he worked in. Speaks of ethnic groups in town.
64-107	Lorig, Pakkanine, Pilcher, Goldsworthy	Names various stores family shopped at. Fresh produce was seasonal. He fished and hunted mushrooms as a boy. Names various mushrooms found in the area.
107-158	Taylor, Hood, Hardy, Betts, Cole,	Attended all 12 years of school in Telluride. Names teachers. School sports and activities. Describes the classrooms.
158-187		Speaks of father's wages at different mills he worked in. Summer jobs for young people.
187-260	Pilcher, Mel Henson	Churches and social lodges parents belonged to. Describes July 4th celebration in 40's and 50's. Parade, barbeques, firework displays, mining contests, and dances. Speaks of activities at the recreation hall such as--dances, (public and school), basketball games. Art played in group ensemble for public dances.
260-296		Recreation in winter consisted of skiing and school sports. Talks about the early rope tow used for skiing. Mentions the close community feeling in the town. Talks about the community Christmas Celebrations.
296-307	Dr. Parker, Mrs. Reid, Mrs. Parker, Mrs Wood	Names various doctors and nurses that worked at the hospital during his years here.
307-351		Speaks of the Ajax snow slides. Describes the one in the 50's and the damage it did. Mentions all the old buildings that have been torn down. Memories of fires on Main Street that burned barber shop, beauty parlor and radio store. Also talks about when the school gymnasium burned.
351-380	Ress	Describes the house in town that had a still built into the hillside and could be entered from the house. Speaks of World War II. Rationing books were used for sugar, tires and gasoline.
380-400	H. Reid, A. Penasa, S. Larson, Tony the	Speaks of the water system in town and all the frozen pipes. Story of thawing water pipes and working with Tony The Man

Continues story of City water system.
